REPORTING ON PROGRESS

bughout the EVFS stage you will be invited to attend regular Parent Evening sultations when you can meet with staff to discuss your child's progress. During Summer term in Pre-Prep and Reception you will receive a written report, uding a short narrative on your child's characteristics of effective learning. Parent sultations and the end of year report will help you to find out how you can work your child at home to support his / her learning.

HOME / SCHOOL LINK

Iks between home and school are highly valued. As your child starts either our Perpo pr Reception class you will receive a Welcome Pack and be invited to a variety events to help support you and your child. Our first event is held in June/July and is opportunity to meet EYFS staff and fellow parents.

During the first few weeks of the autumn term all parents are invited to attend a Meet the Teacher evening when information about daily routines, parent and child contributions to learning journeys, curriculum and key person etc. can be shared. Each week we will send home a newsletter for both Pre-Prep and Reception which will outline the lessons and activities taught that week Staff are available at the beginning and the end of the day to support daily communication with parents. Parents are asked to make an appointment with staff for confidential or longer discussions.





CURRICULUM

The Foundation Stage Curriculum

At Forest Park Preparatory School, we give our children in Reception a broad and balanced Early Years Foundation Stage (EVFS) curriculum, based upon the Early Learning Goals within the seven areas of learning. All children are given equal access to opportunities in order to develop their knowledge and skills in the seve areas of learning:

 Personal, Social and Ernotional Developme Communication and Language Physical Development Mathematics Literacy Expressive Arts and Design Understanding of the World

Learning in Reception is a natural progression and extension of learning in PrePrep. All children learn through play, with a mixture of child-initiated and teacherled learning opportunities. Learning takes place both indoors and outdoors. We believe it is important for our outdoor learning space to reflect and mirror our indoor learning environment and to have specific learning areas for the children to access while outdoors.

An initial informal "Baseline Assessment" will be carried out in the first few weeks to help us support and plan for your child's needs. After observing the children's interactions and interests, we introduce different themes which the children explore through a variety of media including role play, music, malleable materials, paint, sand, water, mark-making, ICT, construction, reading, writing and numeracy games

ENHANCING THE CURRICULUM

To enhance the curriculum, we introduce specialist teachers for Drama, Music, Spanish, and PE. Each child's happiness is paramount and the main aim for Reception is to provide a nurturing and positive environment, where individual needs are foremost, enabling each child to reach their full potential. The children in the Reception class also benefit hugely from our enhanced curriculum. We have Music and French lessons with subject specialists. In addition to this, the children follow a vibrant PE. scheme, with our specialist teacher, which builds the basic skills that children will need in order to progress on to Year 1. This programme also includes dance and ownmastics.

WELCOME TO OUR RECEPTION

REPORTIN

Each term, a written report on your child will be sent home. It will indicate your child's progress and achievement in relation to key learning objectives from the previous term, as well as providing nformation about your child's behaviour and general demeanour. Also, individual targets are sent nome which outline your child's focus areas for development in Maths and English. These are reviewed by teachers on a termiy basis.

addition, an annual academic summative report will be sent home in the summer term. This overs progress across the whole primary curriculum. You will be given the opportunity to meet ith the class teacher to discuss your child's progress and development each term.

WHAT WILL MY CHILD'S LEARNING LOOK LIKE?

ay and exploration is fundamental within our Reception class. It means children are able to noose activities where they can engage with other children or adults or, sometimes, play alone. uring these activities, the children will learn by first-hand experiences, by actively doing as well st through scaffolding and modelling by adults. We will provide them with sufficient space, both doors and outdoors, time and choice with a range of activities. There will be a good variety of anned and prepared activities by the teachers, as well as allowing time for the children to initiate lerior nume learning. Activities will be planned through discussion with the children around their urent interests. as well as taking into account their learning styles and stages of development.

Our environment will enable children to try things out and make sense of relationships, allowing all children to fulfi their potential. As the children progress throughout the year, the academic learning activities increase. Each child continues to be supported and challenged through a lively and motivating curriculum, which caters for each child's individual needs and abilities. In Reception, we have structured literacy and numeracy sessions every morning.

HOME/SCHOOL LIAISON

We pride ourselves on our tearnwork and communication with parents. I hrough this partnership, the children continue to develop their independence and thrive in a setting where each child's evelopment and happiness continues to be foremost. It is often possible to talk to Reception staff ery briefly at the beginning or end of the day but do make an appointment to be sure that they re available if you need more than a few minutes.

URRICULUM

At Forest Park Preparatory School, we aim to provide a broad and balanced curriculum. SPORT

Pupils should continue to apply and develop a troader range of skills, learning how to use them in different ways and to link them to make actions and sequences of movement. They should enjoy communicating, collaborating and competing with each other. They should develop an understanding of how to improve in different physical activities and sports and learn how to evaluate and recognise their com success.

Pupils should be taught to:

- Use running, jumping, throwing and catching in isolation and in combination
- Play competitive games, modified where appropriate [for example, badminton, basketball, cricket, football, hockey, netball, rounders and tennis], and apply basic principles suitable attacking and defending
- Develop flexibility, strength, technique, control and balance [for example, through athletics and gymnastics]
- Perform dances using a range of movement patterns
- lake part in outdoor and adventurous activity challenges both individually and within a team

Our specialist sporting staff not only teach our physical education with in our curriculum but also allow school to be involved in various sporting events and other competition which are not available to all schools.





GETTING CREATIVE

PERFORMING ARTS AND DRAMA

At Forest Park we teach drama and performance as part of the English curriculum. Drama allows children to explore creative ideas, test structures and story lines and experiment with characters and settings. This directly supports their writing, giving them the confidence to try new styles and adapt their writing to suit an audience. It also provides pupils with a personal sense of achievement which develops their personal skills, manifesting an ability to perform and present themselves with confidence.

MUSIC AND PERFORMANCE

Children have the opportunity to enjoy musical experiences through listening, singing, movement and dance and by playing tuned and untuned percussion. Music is taught as a discrete subject and as a means of supporting other areas of the curriculum in order to give pupils the best opportunity to develop their knowledge and skills in this area of the curriculum.

The school has a number of very strong vocal groups, which in recent years, along with many community events, have performed at The Children's Trust Concert at the Manchester Cathedral, The Christmas Lights ceremonies in Sale, and at the Altrincham Music Festival.

ART AND DESIGN AND TECHNOLOGY

Through design and technology, the children are encouraged to identify, examine and solve practical problems and to make existing situations better. The children are encouraged to be inventive, using a range of materials and tools, thus developing, modifying and evaluating their ideas through a series of projects.

The children are encouraged to be spontaneously creative, using a variety of media and techniques in art and craftwork. An awareness of colour, shape, balance, focus and proportion are developed alongside the use of symbols to convey ideas and feelings. The study of a wide range of artists, craftspeople and designers complements this work.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION

At Forest Park there is a strong emphasis on health and fitness outside the classroom. Forest Park believes that all ichildren should be given the opportunity to take part in a wide variety of sporting activities. Our curriculum is personally structured and, in the later years, there is a clear focus placed on the requirements of the Independent and State Grammar Schools entrance examinations at 11+ which runs alongside a rich curriculum influenced by the best parts of the national curriculum. The curriculum remains broad and balanced with a continued emphasis on creativity, questioning, and independent tinking.

IOIMAL ASSESSMENTS: Two formal Assessment Weeks take place annualty in September and May, when children complete assessments in Mathematics, English, Verbal and Non Verbal Reasoning. All assessment data is reviewed by staff and fed back to parents.

PARENTS EVENINGS: Parents' Evenings take place once a term, following a termly progress report. The child's progress report and next steps are discussed with the class teacher. We work very closely with parents in order to ensure a smooth and successful transition to Year 7.

SCHOOL COUNCILS

PUPIL LEADERSHIP


